This 6 week course will explore the 7 last words of Christ as found in the Gospel accounts. A great Lenten study for a more powerful Easter morning! DVD and discussion based study; no workbook/cost.

Just for Guys —join Dr. Steve Hoard for topics that are pertinent for “the guys!” Men only! Session 4’s study is the “*Courageous*” *Living Bible Study*. This bible study is designed to challenge men to live courageously for the sake of their families. Movie clips from “Courageous” and thought-provoking questions will make this a great study!

Divorce Care—led by Bobbie Hewlette, Don and Kathleen Herring. This class will continue from Session 3 and will meet from 5:30—7:00, having dinner in the classroom in order to cover all materials. A little red heart on my driver's license is a symbol to EMTs and ER doctors that I am to be an organ donor in the event of some life-ending accident. Do you have a friend in church who is suffering due to illness, divorce, grief, family problems? Let the church staff know so that person can be offered a Stephen Minister. Are you being nudged by God to do something different in your life? Talk to a Stephen Minister about what we do.
